## Art Scholarship Granted Student in Chicago.

Miss Maureen Lee Bogle, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. M. P. Bogle of Spokane and Tamarack, Idaho, was recently awarded a second \$1000 scholarship from the Three Arts club of Chicago, Ill.

Miss Bogle has been studying at the Chicago Art Institute, where she is now beginning work toward her master's degree in fine arts and education. She just received first prize and an honorable mention, as well as an award for the program cover design at the 13th annual art exhibit and style show, held at the Three Arts club in May.
